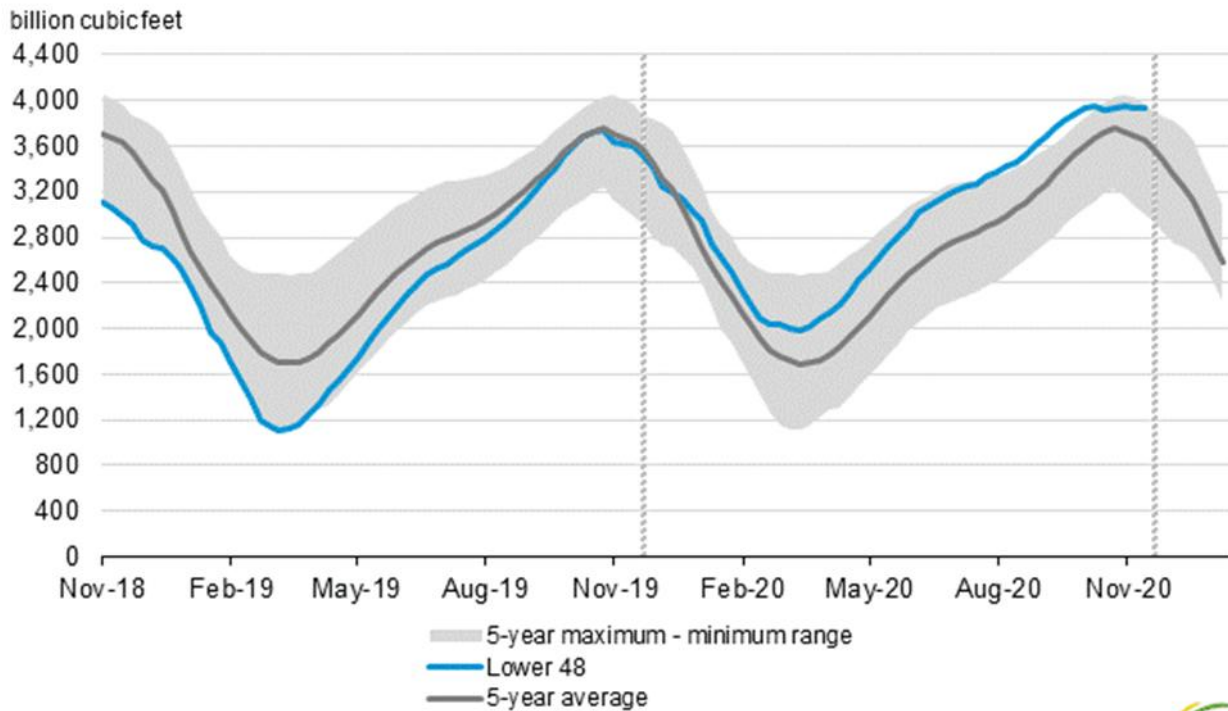

### Summary

Working gas in storage was 3,939 Bcf as of Friday, November 27, 2020, according to EIA estimates. This represents a net decrease of 1 Bcf from the previous week. Stocks were 343 Bcf higher than last year at this time and 290 Bcf above the five-year average of 3,649 Bcf. At 3,939 Bcf, total working gas is within the five-year historical range.

### Prices/Supply/Demand

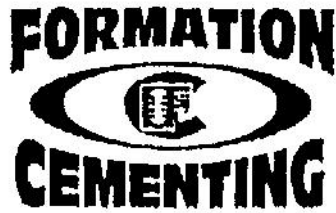
**Northeast prices rise.** At the Transcontinental Pipeline Zone 6 trading point for New York City, the price increased \$1.02 from a low of \$1.43/MMBtu last Wednesday to \$2.45/MMBtu yesterday, with daytime temperatures averaging [60 degrees](#) Fahrenheit. At the Algonquin Citygate, which serves [Boston-area consumers](#), the price went up \$1.03 from a low of \$1.38/MMBtu last Wednesday to \$2.41/MMBtu yesterday. The Algonquin Gas Transmission's (AGT) declared a [force majeure](#) on Thursday at its compressor station in Weymouth, Massachusetts, 12 miles northwest of Boston. The compressor station entered service on October 1 as part of the Atlantic Bridge infrastructure expansion project, but the station has been having operational issues and temporarily shut down. The station recently received permission to restart from the [Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration \(PHMSA\) at reduced pressure](#).

The Tennessee Zone 4 Marcellus spot price increased 97¢ from \$0.95/MMBtu last Wednesday to \$1.92/MMBtu yesterday. The price at Dominion South in southwest Pennsylvania rose 83¢ from \$1.11/MMBtu last Wednesday to \$1.94/MMBtu yesterday.

**Supply is flat.** According to data from IHS Markit, the average total supply of natural gas remained the same as in the previous report week, averaging 95.8 Bcf/d. Dry natural gas production decreased by 0.6% compared with the previous report week. Average net imports from Canada increased by 14.0% from last week, offsetting the production decline.

**U.S. LNG exports are flat week over week.** Eighteen LNG vessels (five from Sabine Pass, four from Freeport, three from Cameron, and two each from Cove Point, Corpus Christi, and Elba Island) with a combined LNG-carrying capacity of 65 Bcf departed the United States between November 26 and December 2, 2020, according to shipping data provided by Bloomberg Finance, L.P.

U.S. LNG exports set a new monthly record in November, averaging 9.4 Bcf/d, according to EIA's estimates based on the shipping data provided by Bloomberg Finance, L.P. LNG exports in November were 17% higher than the previous monthly record set in January 2020 at 8.0 Bcf/d.

During the Fourth quarter of 2019, Ohio's horizontal shale wells produced 5,813,755 barrels of oil and 614,218,362 Mcf (614 billion cubic feet) of natural gas, according to the figures released today by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR).

Compared to a year ago, oil production increased by 29.54% and natural gas production showed a 10.81% increase over the second quarter of 2018.

The ODNR quarterly report lists 2,523 horizontal shale wells, 2,452 of which reported oil and natural gas production during the quarter. Of the wells reporting oil and natural gas results:

There are currently 3,336 Utica Permits, and 2,825 Utica shale wells drilled, with 11 rigs running.

## What if OSHA Showed Up Right Now?

What if OSHA Showed Up Right Now? Would you let them in? Would you call your boss? Would you call your attorney? Would you call your safety consultant? Would you turn them away?

The fact is, there are very specific rights you have if OSHA comes knocking.

Normally, OSHA inspections are performed without advanced notice. However, employers do have the right to require compliance officers to obtain a warrant before entering the workplace. Make sure you are familiar with your company policy before OSHA shows up so you know how to respond appropriately.

OSHA inspection guidelines require that compliance officers present their credentials at the very beginning of an inspection. These credentials are official and include a photograph – a business card alone is not an appropriate presentation of credentials.

You have the right to know why a compliance officer is seeking entry into your facility. OSHA cannot randomly walk onto your worksite. There must be at least one condition which allows an inspection to begin. These include imminent danger situations, a severe illness or injury was reported, a worker complaint, a referral from another federal, state or local agency, a targeted high-hazard industry and follow-up inspections. Following the presentation of credentials the inspector will perform an opening conference which explains why they are there and the scope of the inspection. At this point you can select a representative to accompany the officer during their inspection. An employee representative also has the right to accompany the officer during the inspection.

Following the opening conference a walkthrough of the portions of the workplace covered by the scope is performed. This can include photos, recordings and measurements. The inspector may also review illness and injury records at this time. The inspector may also point out any apparent violations. Interviews may be held with workers at this time. Inspectors may also make requests for documents and policies related to safety. It is important that you understand your rights under the law and also your company policy so you respond appropriately to these requests.

Following the walk around and any employee interviews, a closing conference is held to discuss the findings and courses of action you may take after the inspection including informal conference, contesting citations and proposed penalties. At the end of the closing conference, the fact finding portion of the inspection is completed.

If any violations of standards or serious violations are identified, OSHA may issue citations and fines. OSHA must issue citations and proposed penalties within six months of the violation's occurrence. Citations issued describe OSHA requirements violated, proposed penalties and assign deadlines for correcting the alleged hazards.

As you can see, navigating OSHA inspections and citations can be a complicated process. Make sure you are familiar with your company's policy regarding OSHA inspections on site. Know how to protect both your workers and your company. If you require assistance, help can be obtained from legal professionals specializing in OSHA cases and private safety and health consulting firms. The steps you take at the beginning of an OSHA inspection are crucial to the outcome of the inspection.
